# Preliminary Report of Archaeological Excavations at Hayatabad, Peshawar: Field Season 2019

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Abstract: This preliminary report is based on the archaeological investigations conducted by the Department of Archaeology, University of Peshawar, at the Hayatabad site for the third field season from February to May 2019. The Department of Archaeology has already executed field explorations and excavations at the same site in 2017 and 2018, whose reports have been published in this journal (Khan et al. 2019, 2020). These excavations brought into light structural remains and numerous archaeological finds like coins, terracotta figurines, stone and terracotta beads, stone tools, pottery and iron objects. The evidences reveals that the site under discussion had been occupied from the second century BCE to the end of second century CE. Accordingly, it was founded during the time of the Indo-Greeks and remained in occupation until the rule of the Great Kushans. The characteristic features of this site are the smith workshops systematically built in a sequence at different levels of occupation. In addition, a group of workshops were equipped with working platforms, furnaces, fixed crucibles, grinding stones, stone anvils and large quenching pots.

#### Introduction

This archaeological site, located due west of Filling Station in Hayatabad (Phase V), lies within the plot allotted to the Edwards School and College Peshawar. In view of the Google Earth reading, the excavated area of the sites is placed at 33°59'42.66"N and 71°26'30.06"E (Fig. 1). According to the geographical archives of the Google Earth Maps, the site was extended towards north up to across the main Torkham Road. Perhaps it was further extended towards north, the area beyond the roadside was once used as Afghan refugees camp after 1978. The refugees camp is now abandoned, the area is cleared up, and the kaccha houses of the refugees have been levelled to convert this part of the site into a flat land. The existing area of the mound (south of the drain) is found intact, which yielded remarkable results during excavations.

In view of the encouraging results of the previous excavations, location and physical condition of the site, the Department of Archaeology, University of Peshawar, was keen to resume excavations for the third field season during the summer in 2019. Thus, we successfully carried out the third seasonal excavation with the main objective in mind to get more archaeological evidence to widen the scope of our understanding of the cultural activities at the site duly complemented by the other objective of providing an opportunity to the students for their field training. This year too, the excavation was conducted under the supervision of Professor Ibrahim Shah, Chairman of the Department of Archaeology. The field team also remained the same; led by Professor Gul Rahim Khan and assisted by Mr. Muhammad Naeem Bacha (Surveyor-cum-draughtsman) and the BS, MA, MPhil and PhD students.

For this wonderful experience, we are grateful to Mr. Humphrey Sarfaraz Peters, Bishop of Peshawar, for granting approval to resume our field work here and for extending all kind of cooperation and support, which concluded our excavations in a very promising manner. Our discussion with him

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in the light of the published reports of previous excavations at the site increased his curiosity to dig up at the site further to know more about the cultural heritage of the region. He assured us to extend moral and material support to conserve and preserve significant architectural features and remains of metallurgical installations at the site for the purpose of promoting heritage value on one hand and to develop it partly as a cultural tourism spot on the other. We pay our debt of gratitude to Professor Sara Safdar, Secretary to the Bishop, for her kind help and cooperation. She was also keenly interested in archaeological value of the site and its significant cultural history that has opened our eyes about the technological advancement of Peshawar during the second/first century BCE. The Department of Archaeology pays thanks to the Peshawar Development Authority (PDA) for its continuous support provided to our field activities. We are also thankful to Dr. Abdul Samad, Director, Directorate of Archaeology and Museums, Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, who regularly granted us licence and extended moral support to further our field activities at the Hayatabad site. ### Fresh Excavations

In the third field season, we extended our excavations towards south and east sides along the trenches opened during the previous field work.

To the south side, we initially selected six trenches for digging duly marked as AI/22, AI/23, BI/2, BI/3, AI/ 25 and AII/21 and then, to the east and southeast, we further selected six more trenches, i.e. AII/12, AII/ 13, AII/17, AII/18, AII/22 and AII/23 respectively. In addition, we reopened our previous trench AI/17, which was left incomplete due to complex structures found in the upper strata during 2017 excavations. Accordingly, we worked altogether in thirteen trenches. The size of each trench was 6x6 metre (including baulk).

We took start of fresh excavations from AI/17 and there we reached the virgin soil at the depth of 4.5 feet. This trench was certainly a workshop

compound continuously used in three different periods. The stone structures found here were superimposed in three occupational levels. Three circular furnaces and four stone walls were found together just after layer 1 (Pl. 3b). These stone walls make a rectangular room with long parallel walls lying east to west and small walls north to south. The long walls are intact and well finished in their alignments. These walls consisted of two to three courses and the southwest corner was left open perhaps for a door or structure has collapsed in due course of time. Of these, the south wall lay in trench AI/22 and the east in the baulk of AI/18. These upper-level structures with contemporary layers (nos. 1-4) belong to the Kushan period. Below this, there is a small cubical room of stone structures exposed in the northeast corner of the compartment and trench under discussion. Two of its walls on the north and east lay underneath the previous walls (Pls. 6a-b, 7a). One large broken pot inside the room and many broken potsherds outside were found scattered at the same floor level (Pls. 4b, 5a, 7b). This cubical room might be associated with the Indo-Scythian period, who ruled before the Kushans. Beneath this, further stone structures on the three sides, i.e. north, east and south, were lying in the same orientation as the structure of the upper strata (i.e. the Kushans) were exposed. Large and regular stone blocks were used in the construction of these walls. Along with these walls, we found a large circular crucible with stone foundation and a rectangular furnace filled with ashes in the southeast corner of the large rectangular room (Pls. 8a-b). These features obviously belong to the Indo-Greek period.

To the south of AI/17, we started work in trenches AI/22 and AI/23 simultaneously. One long stone structure perhaps built in two phases (periods) lies in east-west orientation and just described in the structures found in trench AI/17. The remaining structures of this trench (AI/22) are collapsed and in ruined condition. However, one stone structure of north-south orientation is found along the western section of trench AI/22 and a foundation corner of two mud-walls appeared in the east side. One mud wall is coming from south side and another from east side, i.e.,

trench AI/23, and joined at northeast corner of the trench. A large stone anvil in rectangular shape is reported from the same level. This wall seems to be of the Indo-Greek period. Besides this, traces of another mudbrick wall in east-west orientation was also exposed along the southern section of the trench.

The general features of trench AI/23 are almost the same as we noted in AI/22. The walls exposed in this trench are found in north-south and eastwest orientations. A narrow stone wall was found in east-west direction along the entire northern section of the trench and joined by another wall at the northeast corner. The second wall partly broken in the middle was likewise found parallel with the eastern section of the trench (Pl. 3a). Corresponding to the afore-mentioned walls, fragmentary stone structures of a square room can be seen in the southeast and northwest sides of the trench, but they are collapsed and not so noteworthy as to be discussed here. The western wall was erected in two stages and perhaps belonged to the Indo-Scythian and Kushan periods (Pl. 9a). A foundation of mudbrick wall in east-west orientation was exposed in the middle of the trench. The terminal ends of mud structure occurred underneath the foundation of the abovementioned stone structures (Pl. 5b). This structure belongs to the Indo-Greek period. Along with stone structure, we found three circular furnaces, one rough type of crucible, one stone anvil, two grinding stones and a large broken storage jar in the upper strata.

A long wall of mudbricks exposed in trench AI/22 seems interesting due to its clear alignment of large bricks and thick size of the wall. In search of this wall, we opened two more trenches, i.e. BI/2 and BI/3. Accordingly, we fully exposed this wall which was a long and huge mud-brick structure lies in east-west orientation (Pl. 11c). Beside this, a fragment of stone wall was built parallel on the south side of this huge wall.

After this, we moved to trenches AI/25 and AII/21, a southern extension of previous excavations. In this area, we cleared up both trenches in minimum time and reached the virgin soil at the depth of merely 2.5 feet. This particular area reveals that early occupation

was made in raised terrace of the site. In these trenches, there was no regular stone structure, but we noted fallen debris of a long stone structures in east-west orientation found scattered along the northern section of two trenches. A group of four compartments can be seen together in both trenches. A junction of these structures was found almost in the middle or slightly towards south of these trenches. The remains of six walls indicate that these compartments were made of mudbricks. In other features, we found a perfect conical crucible with stone foundation AI/25 (Pls. 14a, 15c-d). Similarly, in trench AII/21, we unearthed a U-shaped oven (Pls. 14b, 15a) along the mud structure; it is supported by three individual stones on the three sides and filled with ashes. On the right side of the oven, there was a large stone anvil and on its left side a fragile ladle of iron (Pl. 15b) found at short distances. In the middle of trench AII/21, a small mud oven in semi-circular shape (Pl. 14c) excavated in the upper level and a circular pit (dump area) of considerable size filled with ashes in the lower level (Pls. 13b, 14ab). The mudbrick structures and related features, particularly crucible, belonged to the Indo-Greek period.

In the third stage of excavation, we carried out deep work in six trenches (AII/12, AII/13, AII/17, AII/18, AII/22, AII/23) located to the east of the trenches exposed above. In the beginning, we opened these trenches one by one and then went deep simultaneously when layout of structures became clear. The plan of structures of this zone was different and fascinating where a special workshop complex seems to have been established. On the west, this area was bounded by a huge structure of mud lumps inserted with large mudbricks at regular intervals. A similar structure was also exposed in the east side, which seems parallel to the west side wall, but we did not excavate it due to the limits of marked trenches and financial constraints. The walls were erected apparently in two phases of construction still found up to considerable height. In the east side of this compound, we touched the virgin soil at the depth of 6.3 feet, which is the deepest level of occupation at the site known so far.

This independent zone of workshop consisted

of four rooms in a row (north-south) with a narrow corridor on the west and, in later period, it was blocked by a stone wall towards the north side. On the east side, there is another series of three connected rooms and the southeast chamber fully exposed is longer but narrow in dimension (Pl. 19c). The central chamber of smith workshop was furnished with variety of fixtures and a key example of its kind so far reported from the site. This workshop contains two crucibles, twin circular furnaces, two stone anvils, one quenching port and a square oven of hard clay filled with ashes and charcoals usually installed in the middle strata. This workshop also comprises an attached storage area for keeping tools and raw material (Pls. 17b, 24a-b, 26a-b). The southern room of the same size in a central row accommodates a base of quenching pot and a circular furnace all found in the upper strata (Pls. 17a, 19c). To the north of the main chamber, there is a rectangular room later blocked by a small wall from corridor side. In this area, we unearthed a circular furnace in the upper layer and large rectangular furnace and many small postholes made on floor level in the lower layers (Pls. 22b, 26a-b). To the north of this room, there was another smith chamber equipped with two circular furnaces, shallow crucible with inner chamber for fire and a quenching pot (Pls. 20c, 22a, 28d-f). These features, except a quenching pot usually installed on the floor level in the lower layers. The southeast, long chamber contained a semi-circular oven and a stone anvil. To the east of the central chamber, there is a small portion of another room comprised of a series of three shallow ovens in rectangular shape. These ovens were built at regular intervals and filled with ashes and charcoals (Pls. 27a-b). This series of oven was unearthed in the upper strata.

Another interesting feature of this area is perhaps a kitchen. It was found in AII/12 outside the main compound. The kitchen was built in a small square room (partly missing), which contained large number of terracotta utensils mostly in broken condition (Pls. 21a-b). These fragmentary objects include small goblets, jars, pitchers, bowls, a storage pot and a grinding stone. They were all found at the lower floor level mixed with ashes.

#### Structural Remains

The excavated area of all trenches dominantly consists of workshop area. The layout of structures and their alignments was the same as we observed in the previous excavations (i.e., 2017 and 2018). But due to some new variety of structures, these walls are known in six types of masonry:

- a. Semi-diaper,
- b. Walls of different stones mixed with mud lumps,
- c. Rough stone courses filled with mud lumps,
- d. Single mudbrick walls,
- e. Multiple mudbrick walls, and
- f. Mudbricks within lump structure.

The average width of stone walls is 60 centimeters (a-c), single mudbrick wall 30 centimeters (d), multi mudbrick wall 150 centimeters (e) and compound wall (mud-lumps and bricks) 260 centimeters (f). The semi-diaper masonry is known in two examples reported from a deep level of excavations at AII/13 (Pls. 19a-b). The latter variety of walls (var. f) are the exceptional examples as they were unearthed for the first time. These types of massive structures were obviously used in the boundary walls of smith compounds. The massive mud-walls accommodating mudbricks in rows of four alignments are known from two different areas. Of these, one example lying in east-west orientation is reported from trenches AI/22, AI/23 and BI/3, and another also made in north-south direction from AII/18 and AII/23 (Pls. 18b, 19c, 20a). The latter example is a superimposed structure made over the wall of small stones. Parallel to it, similar wall lying in north-south alignment was built as the western boundary wall for the compound of smith workshop. It is known from trenches AII/12, AII/17 and AII/22 (Fig. 4, Pls. 16b, 20a, 23b, 25b, 26a, 28a-b). This wall is made of hard mud-lumps whereas large square mudbricks are inserted into it at regular intervals. The structure of this variety (var. f) is quite different from other mudbrick walls.

The mudbrick walls are usually seen in the structures of early level and often reported from

trenches AI/22, AI/23, AI/25 and AII/21. In many examples, certain walls are identified by the alignment of one or two courses of mudbricks (Fig. 3, Pls. 5b, 13b, 14a). In trench AI/23, only the foundation of a mudbrick wall (east-west positioning) is traced out while its ends (east and west) are lying underneath the bases of the upper-level stone walls (Fig. 3, Pl. 5b). In one specimen, this type of wall was built over the early period stone wall running east to west orientation in trench AII/18 (Fig. 4, Pl. 26b).

In view of the workshop designs, some structures were made in more sophisticated form. Of these, a series of five (perhaps more) workshops was built in a rectangular compound unearthed at AII/12, AII/13, AII/17, AII/18, AII/22 and AII/23 (Fig. 4, Pls. 16b, 19c, 20a, 25a-b, 26a-b). The walls of these workshops are usually intact and made in two phases of construction. These structures were built in superimposed position where the walls of the later phase were erected over the same alignment of previous remains. In two cases, the lower walls were made in semidiaper masonry (Pls. 19a-b). On the east and west sides, this compound was bounded by massive walls (vars. e-f). These workshops were made in the form of square and rectangular rooms (Fig. 4, Pls. 19c, 20a, 25a-b, 26a-b).

Some architectural remains are very important for understanding the occupational phases and chronology of the site. The more intact stone walls are known from trenches AI/17 and AI/18. The trench AI/18 was already dug out during our previous excavations, but partly re-exposed to know about the nature, position and connection of different walls found in junction one above the other. It is interesting to note that some structures of one phase are identified by a single course of stones wall. As described earlier, a rectangular workshop of the late phase preceded by a small cubical room perhaps used as storage area was built within walls of the early and the late phases of structures. Two of its walls are plunged into main walls of the early and the late phases workshop but the walls of the middle phase slightly project out of the main alignment and hence occurred parallel to its other two walls. This middle phase structure consists of two courses of rough stone

masonry (Fig. 3, Pls. 6a-b, 7a-b, 8a-b).

### Furnaces and Workshops

Our excavations for three consecutive field seasons have revealed the fact that the Havatabad site is well known for the establishment of smith workshops. In 2017, we identified eight smith chambers, while in 2018, we noticed six more compartments of smith workshops (Khan et al. 2019, 2020). In continuation to this series, we unearthed twelve more workshops during the third season of excavations. The newly exposed workshops are marked with the serial number W15 to W26. The size and nature of rooms vary from area to area and period to period. In previous excavations, we recognised such workshops with occurrences of two features found together in one compound. But this year, some workshops are also marked by a single feature due to the nature of disturbance and cutting edges of area. The remaining features perhaps would have been dislocated due to the recent past constructions and other activities carried out at the site. These workshops, as described in our previous reports, usually represented by furnaces, ovens, anvils, crucibles, quenching pots and grinding stones. Sometimes dumped ashes are also found in adjacent pits built for this purpose. As a result of our fresh excavations, we dug up seven crucibles, fifteen furnaces, ten stone anvils, four quenching pots, one stone, six mud ovens and three grinding stones of certain workshops.

Of these, one is a twin and the remaining are single furnaces; all are circular in shape with diameter of 30 cm. However, structure and composition of these furnaces are not uniform. These furnaces are usually built with a thick level of terracotta bits bound by hard clay and the top is finished with vertical bits in concentric circles. In many cases, a broad terracotta plate of the same size is placed underneath such furnaces.

Like previous excavations, this year also two types of crucibles unearthed; one type is smaller in size dug up from upper strata and the second type larger in size from lower level. Small type of crucibles are rough and shallow with their inner surface often tightened with terracotta bits. Of these, one example of small crucibles is

fascinating and new for its complex design and purpose. It is made in bowl shape without stone foundation to which a small channel filled with ashes is provided at the base for keeping the molten metal heated (Fig. 4, Pls. 28d-f). It lies in trench AII/19 (W19) reported from the middle strata (i.e., the second phase) of the deposit. In the second type, there are two crucibles, one is known from trench AI/17 (W15) and another from AI/25 (W24). These crucibles are uniform in shape, size, and design. They are made in large conical shape with semi-burnt hard clay walls and stone bases (Figs. 3, 5, Pls. 10a-b, 11a-b, 14a, 15cd). The interior of such crucibles is finished with fine hard surface. This type of crucible is always reported from the lower levels and obviously belonged to the Indo-Greek period.

The quenching pots are known in two types: the medium size pots picked up from the upper strata and large size pots from the lower strata. Unfortunately, no complete pot is witnessed from fresh excavations. The remains of these pots are known in fragments and typically base portions are found intact in situ (Pl. 20c). The large pots of this category usually belong to the Indo-Greek era.

The ovens (and hearths) are known in several varieties. Of these, one U-shaped oven composed of three elongated stones filled with ashes and charcoal fragments is new and interesting (Pl. 15a). This is a simple form of oven and still being used in Peshawar and surrounding region for temporary use. Besides this, two semi-circular ovens of hard clay are known from AI/17 and BI/2 trenches, and they also come from the Indo-Greek level. Another similar oven of clay has appeared in trench AII/23. It was found in the middle deposit of trench (Pl. 18a). The third variety of oven was unearthed at the upper strata in trench AII/18. It was composed of three small rectangular compartments like cooking range organized in a row against the stone wall. This series of oven filled with ashes and charcoal bits was found fixed on the upper floor level (Fig. 4, Pls. 27a-b). The fourth variety of oven was made of hard clay in a square shape (which looks like diamond) but its function is not very clear. It seems to have been made within compact floor level in workshop area

(W21). This oven was also filled with loose soil and ashes (Pls. 24b, 33c). The last variety of oven is known in the form of a rectangular red compact surface and perhaps used as a temporary oven or furnace (Pl. 28c).

There had been extensive application of large stone anvils, grinders and sharpeners in smith workshops. They were naturally large cuboid stones and sometimes trimmed from lateral sides for required work platform (Figs. 3-5, Pls. 13b, 18b, 22b, 24a-b, 32c). The edges and sides of such stones were sometimes used as sharpeners too.

### Workshop 15 (W15)

This rectangular workshop is located in trench AI/17 and at the same area where W7 of the late phase was already located and marked in the upper strata (Fig. 3). But the new workshop, uncovered at the lower level, obviously belonged to the Indo-Greek period. It was established in a long rectangular chamber bounded by stone walls on the three sides. It comprises a large conical crucible with flat stone base and filled with ashes, charcoal bits and potsherds coated with black soot. It is accompanied with a circular furnace and semicircular oven filled with ashes. A medium size grinding stone with pestle above underneath the southern wall was also found nearby these features.

### Workshop 16 (W16)

This workshop lies to the southeast of W15, i.e. on east side of the wall (Fig. 3). Perhaps, it was established in a rectangular room bounded by stone walls on the three sides. The surviving walls are made of small stones thus narrow in size. This workshop, installed in the upper level, belonged to the Kushan period. The existing features of this workshop are arranged in triangular form, which include a circular furnace, a stone anvil and a shallow crucible supported by terracotta bits and potsherds.

### Workshop 17 (W17)

Workshop 17 also lies in the same vicinity and adjacent to the south of W16 (Fig. 3). These two

workshops were partitioned by a mudbrick wall as its foundation is traceable on the ground. The chamber of the present workshop was made in square shape whereas two stone walls preserved on the east and west sides. This workshop is identified by two circular furnaces, two stone anvils, one shallow crucible and a base of quenching pot. Besides this, potsherds of a large broken storage pot are also reported from the same area. This workshop seems to have been designed for two smiths working side by side. It was uncovered from the upper level and may be assigned to the late phase (i.e., the Kushan period).

### Workshop 18 (W18)

This workshop is located in trench AI/22 that lies parallel to the west of W17 (Fig. 3). It was made in a square room enclosed within stone walls on the three sides. Foundation of a mudbrick wall, lying north-south orientation, was also detected at the lower level. The area of this workshop is badly disturbed on account of human activities during the recent past. The fallen debris of stone wall are lying in heap with evidence of stagnant water one foot above the early floor level. The only surviving feature of this workshop is identified as the rectangular stone anvil. The remaining features of this workshop were perhaps dismantled due to wreckage of the site mentioned above. This workshop belonged to the early phase of human occupation at the site.

### Workshop 19 (W19)

Workshop 19 is unearthed in trench AII/13 (Fig. 4). This chamber is located within a compound area of smith workshops. It was established in a small cubical room and bounded on the three sides by stone walls. This workshop is furnished with two furnaces, a crucible and a quenching pot. Both furnaces are of normal style; quenching pot is of medium size and the crucible is like a shallow bowl provided with heating tunnel from north side. This workshop belongs to the Indo-Scythian period of Hayatabad site.

### Workshop 20 (W20)

The workshop under discussion is located to the south of W19 and thus placed in a special compound area (Fig. 4). It is a long rectangular room bounded on the four sides by stone walls. On the southwest corner, it was approached through a narrow corridor but, sometime later, this access was blocked by a stone wall due to some unknown reasons. This chamber is provided with different platforms as one furnace is reported from the upper strata. In other devices, it comprises two circular furnaces of normal style, a rectangular oven (or furnace?) of hard red surface and a stone anvil at the northwest corner. There is a series of postholes around the circular furnace that lies close to the stone anvil. These holes were purposely made for some kind of temporary partition or other arrangements. This set up is also associated with the mid phase of the compound and site.

### Workshop 21 (W21)

This workshop is positioned between W20 and W22 in the main compound area (Fig. 4). It is centrally located and considered to be a key workshop of its kind so far unearthed at the site under discussion. It is made in rectangular shape and well protected by stone walls from four sides. It has an attached small storage room on the north side, but nothing is reported from this area. The main chamber is connected to it with a narrow passage on the west side. All features of this workshop are installed on the west side. It comprises twin circular furnaces of tiny broken potsherds accumulated above terracotta plates, two bowl-shaped crucibles finished with terracotta bits, three stone anvils, one grinding stone, a square oven (or furnace?) with straight hard walls built inside the floor level and a base of quenching pot. This workshops obviously belonged to the mid phase of site occupation.

### Workshop 22 (W22)

In shape and design, this workshop has close resemblance with that of the previous one (W21). It is also rectangular in shape and surrounded by stone walls on the four sides (Fig. 4). This chamber

is partly damaged (east and west walls) towards north due to recent past constructions. The recent human settlement also uprooted other fixtures of the workshops. In spite of such disturbances, two circular furnaces of usual design and a base of quenching pot are well preserved. Like other workshops, it also belongs to the Indo-Scythian period.

### Workshop 23 (W23)

This workshop lies parallel to the east of W22 (Fig. 4). It is rectangular in shape and much narrow from east to west sides. The walls exposed on the four sides were built in two stages. The west and south walls are made of stones, the lower portion of north and east walls are also worked in stones, while the superimposed structures are made up of mudbricks. The western wall as described above, is partly damaged. The eastern wall is enormous in width and partially concealed in the unexcavated area. The latter wall seems to be a boundary wall of the entire compound from east side. The workshop features found in this chamber include two stone anvils and one semi-circular oven with ashes and charcoal fragments. These features belong to the Indo-Scythian stratum.

### Workshop 24 (W24)

Workshop 24 is situated outside the main compound area and unearthed at trench AI/25 (Fig. 5). It was established in a square room bounded on the three sides by mudbrick structures. The existing walls are of low height and the lowest level in these trenches is also not very deep. There are fallen debris of a stone wall (east-west orientation) in a row along the north section of the trench. This workshop is characterized by a large conical crucible with large stone foundation and a standard circular furnace. In design, this crucible is identical with the one reported from W15 (Fig. 3). In view of occupation and design of the crucible, this workshop was obviously built during the Indo-Greek period.

### Workshop 25 (W25)

This workshop is located parallel to the east of W24 and reported from trench AII/21 (Fig. 5).

This area seems to be terrace zone of the site. The said workshop was constructed in a square chamber and bounded by mudbrick walls on the south and west sides. The fallen debris of a stone wall, as seen with W24, are lying scattered along the north side of the trench. The main features consist of a semi-circular oven (perhaps furnace) and a pit of considerable size filled with ashes. This pit was probably used as a dumping area for burnt material. Due to the occurrence of certain features at the lower stratum, this smith workshop can be assigned to the Indo-Greek period.

### Workshop 26 (W26)

The last workshop of the present excavations is also reported from AII/21 (Fig. 5). It was constructed parallel to the south of W25. Only north portion of the workshop has been exposed while the remaining area lies buried in unexcavated trenches. This chamber is encompassed within mudbrick walls, visible on the west and north sides. The north wall is existed at considerable height. This workshop comprises one large stone anvil and a U-shaped oven supported by stone blocks on the three sides. These features are installed against the north wall of the chamber. The oven was filled with ashes and charcoal fragments. Besides this, a large ladle of iron, though fragile and broken into pieces, found inside the workshop. This workshop was made contemporary with W24 and W25 and dated to the same era.

#### **Small Finds**

The small finds are few in number but yield great interest for the scholars of diverse fields. The general trend and outcome of these finds is nearly the same as we picked up during our previous excavations at the site (Khan *et al.* 2019, 2020). These artefacts include copper coins, terracotta human and animal figurines, variety of beads, arrowheads, bangles, grinding stones, sharpeners, pestles and large number of potsherds.

The human figurines are usually female executed in baroque style like those reported from Shaikhan Dheri, Sar Dheri (Charsadda), Taxila and the previous excavations at Hayatabad. They have pinched nose, appliqué eyes and wear

variety of ear and hair ornaments and necklaces. The lower body of these figurines is uniform in design shown with joint legs separated by a deep curved vertical line, feet often broken and pudendum marked with waist band round body. The hair fallen on the back side are identified by incised lines like strands of hair. This year, animal figurines are quite few and perhaps characterize bull with curved horns. One terracotta wheel of a cart is also uncovered.

The beads, like our work of the previous seasons, are unearthed in good number. These beads are made of cornelian, white glass, faience, terracotta and other stones. Of these, short cone and bicone beads of terracotta are common. Some terracotta beads are decorated with geometrical incised lines and dots. The bangles usually made of shell and glass are known in large and small fragments.

The iron objects are also reported in substantial number. The jewellery marked by the only one earring (or finger ring?) in damaged condition is reported. Like our previous field experience, iron arrowheads and drills were also unearthed in considerable number. The arrow heads are usually known in three-flanged shape furnished with pointed tip and tang at the opposite ends. Other iron objects include knife, nails and hooks. This year, iron sickles are absent from assemblage. The most common object of this excavation is the stone pestle, which are known in different sizes and shapes such as oblong, elliptical, ovate, orbicular, cuboid, cylindrical etc. Some pestles are ground, smoothed and well finished while others are in natural form. These tools often bear striking, grinding and rubbing marks on their ends, edges and sides. Similarly, querns (grinding stones) of different sizes are known in rectangular, oval, rhomboid and deltoid shapes. Most of these querns are found in broken condition. The grinding (upper) surface of these querns is well made, while the lower side is often left unfinished. Stone sharpeners, both of large and small sizes, are identified in different varieties viz. rectangular, trapezoidal, triangular oblong and acuminate. These objects were used for sharpening different types of tools. The front side of small sharpeners, utilized for working, is

regularly smoothed and flattened and the opposite side is found in ordinary outline.

### Pottery

As noted during our previous field investigations at the Hayatabad site, immense number of potsherds including some complete vessels are unearthed in the 2019 excavations. These potsherds are consistently found at all levels and all trenches of the excavated area. Like our previous experience (2017 and 2018), the present field report also includes images, description and drawing of some complete vessels and selected potsherds bearing significant features and designs. Accordingly, the demonstration of the present pottery is the continuation of the pattern experienced previously. Apart from this, some new types and designs also appeared on potsherds to be treated as a new contribution. This assemblage is also found parallel with other collections reported from different Buddhist and settlement sites located in the vales of Peshawar and Taxila, and Afghanistan. As we already described in our previous report, the pottery of the Hayatabad site shows close similarity with those reported from Sirkap (Marshall 1951; Ghosh 1947-48), Shaikhan Dheri (Dani and Fidaullah 1965-66; Hussain 1980), Damkot (Rahman 1968-69) and early period of Aziz Dheri (Nasim Khan 2010). Of these, detailed work has been carried on the classification and analytical study of the pottery recovered from Taxila and Shaikhan Dheri (Marshall 1951; Hussain 1980). In view of the comparison of pottery, coin and other archaeological finds, the chronology of the Hayatabad site in now well established. In view of shape, fabric, design, texture and decoration scheme, the present accumulation of pottery widely occurs in these three periods. The evidence obviously confirms occupation of the site during the rule of the Indo-Greeks, the Indo-Scythians and the Kushans; thus dating from the second century BCE down to the second century of our

The pottery of the Indo-Greek period is characterised by short pedestalled cups, large storage vessels, medium globular pots, deep and shallow dishes with splayed rims, water flasks including condensers and standard jars. The pottery of this period ranges from medium to thin fabric, properly baked and finely accomplished. Most of the pottery is pinkish to red and some grey ware are also known. Some sherds of medium fabric are highly sophisticated with fine smoothed surface of red slip. Thick potsherds of storage pots are comparatively found less fine and often produced with thin to medium black core. Some complete pots of this period like small bottle with narrow neck and broad finial are very fascinating. Besides this, rims, bases, short pedestals, lugs, spouts, lids and other parts of variety of pots are picked up in fragments. These rims are known in different shapes, designs and sizes such as straight, everted, out-curved, incurved, triangular, squarish, flared, flat, etc. Most of the rims are plain but some are decorated with simple incised lines on the inner side. The flattened rims of pedestalled cups are characteristically painted with geometrical designs like triangles, hatched triangles and parallel vertical lines. The interior basis of plates is often painted with hatched triangles, oblique lines and circles. Sometimes, shoulders of large pots like pitchers are decorated with floral and geometrical design in black paintings.

Bases of the Indo-Greek period pottery are also known is diverse varieties such as low disc, low convex body, plain and ring-cut flattened shapes, shallow and deep concave in domical form. The latter variety is normally associated with pedestalled cups. The fabric, shape and other features of these potsherds help to reconstruct variety of pots such as bowls of various designs, pitchers of different sizes, dishes, water flasks, plates, saucers, jars, storage vessels, cooking pots, bottles, etc.

Of these, two potsherds, i.e., a standard bowl and a plate are noteworthy for some explanations. A highly ornamented bowl of uniform design was produced through a mould technique. The exterior body is decorated with zigzag lines in high relief arranged in two tiers. Each tier is further decorated with dotted borders. The other sherd is a flat base depicting a human figure kneeling to right in low relief. The figure is shown on the interior side of plate. The head of the figure enframed by bead-

and-reel border is missing.

The Indo-Scythian period comprises almost the same variety of pots and potsherds, but sometimes stamped with lotus motifs particularly inside the bowls. Other stamped designs include sun symbol with oblique rays, rayed star with dots, concentric circles around shoulder of pitchers. Sometimes these shoulders are also decorated with denticulate patterns in one or double rows. Some thick storage jars are decorated with cordon of rope pattern and shoulders with variety of incised wavy lines.

The earthenware of the Kushan period is almost the continuation of the Indo-Scythians. They have introduced some changes in types such as cups, large bowls, drinking cups and water pitchers. Some of the previous designs like cordon with rope pattern, variety of denticulate decoration and zigzag lines inside of large vessels are found prominent during this period. The pottery of this period is found in abundance.

### Coins and Chronology

The present season of our excavations yielded altogether 16 copper coins, which is appropriate number for understanding the sequence and chronology of the site. The chronology of this site has already been established due to an adequate number of coins reported during the first two seasons of our field work (Khan *et al.* 2019, 2020). These results recognised the following three periods at the Hayatabad site:

Period I: The Indo-Greeks

(Second century BCE)

Period II: The Indo-Scythians

(First century BCE)

Period III: The Kushans

(First to Second century CE)

The coins unearthed during the present excavations also reveals the same episode of the Hayatabad site. Of these, two coins belong to the Indo-Greeks, two to the Indo-Scythians, eight to the Kushans and one is uncertain due to its poor state of preservation. The first coin of the present excavation was of Apollodotus (the Indo-Greek

ruler) and the last one was that of Huvishka (the Kushan ruler). In 2018 excavation, we had also the same evidences as last coin of the stuff was assigned to the same ruler of the Kushan dynasty. Thus, the coins of the present excavations firmly settle the sequence and periodization of the site already established previously.

Of the Indo-Greek stuff, we unearthed one copper coin of Menander I. Any example of this ruler was not known in our previous excavations. The subject coin depicts elephant's head on one side and upright club on the other. The single coin of Apollodotus is of the previous type, portraying standing figure of Apollo on the obverse and tripod on the reverse. Both these coins are in poor state of preservation. The coins of Eukratides, well represented in the previous fieldworks, are absent from the fresh finds.

The Indo-Scythian dynasty is represented by two copper coins of Azes II, the last ruler of the dynasty. One of these coins shows enthroned city goddess on the obverse and, perhaps the figure of Greek god Hermes on the reverse. This coin was struck in reduced tetradrachm of Indian weight. The second example exhibits the figure of bull on the obverse and lion on the reverse. This is the

common type of Azes II coinage and well known from previous excavations as well. This coin is known in full tetradrachm weight of Indian standard. In the third season of excavations, the occurrence of the coins of Azes II is comparatively reduced.

As described above, the Kushan dynasty is represented by eight coins. Of these, one coin is of Wima Taktu (Soter Megas), three coins of Wima Kadphises, five coins of Kanishka and two coins of Huvishka. Apart from this, the uncertain example seems to be of Herakles type of Kujula Kadphises. The distribution of the Kushan coins is almost the same as those reported from 2018 excavations (Khan et al. 2020). The single coin of Soter Megas type is of normal issue and struck at didrachm unit of Attic standard. It has the bust of Mithra (or king) on the obverse, and the king riding on horseback on the reverse. Two coins of Wima Kadphises are of full weight (tetradrachm) and one quarter (drachm) unit of reduced weight of Attic standard. The design of all such coins is the same, showing standing figure of king at altar on the obverse and Oesho with bull facing right on the reverse. Five coins of Kanishka occur into three denominations, i.e., reduced tetradrachm,

didrachm and drachm of Attic weight standard. The first two varieties are represented by one example each, and the third variety by three coins. The obverse design of all varieties is the same as depicting standing figure of king at altar, and inscribed with Bactrian legend. Of these, two coins of the quarter series (nos. 12 & 13) are of subsidiary mint (Kashmir-Hazara mint) as they bear Kharosthi letter in front of the king on obverse. The remaining three coins belong to the main mint. The reverse designs of the main mint represent the figures of sun-god, moongod and fire-god respectively. Similarly, both coins of the subsidiary mint display moon-god on their reverse. The obverse design of the coins of Huvishka is uniform, showing figure of king riding on elephant to right. The reverse of one example exhibits standing figure of moon-god, while another is defaced. Both coins of this ruler belong to the Gandhara mint struck at reduced tetradrachm weight unit.




Figure 2. Layout of site and excavated area; 2019 field is marked by orange colour within black contour








Figure 3. Plan of structures and other archaeological remains found in compound area




Figure 4. Plan of structures and other archaeological remains found in compound area




Figure 5. Plan of structures and other archaeological remains found in compound area




Figure 6. Section drawing of the main section
